The benefits of tree planting are manifold and undeniable. Trees serve as the lungs of our planet, absorbing carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen, thus improving air quality and combating climate change. They provide vital habitat and sustenance for countless species of wildlife, promoting biodiversity & preventing soil erosion.



THE BROAD LEAVES EXPERIMENT

Save Aravali Trust has always been a steadfast champion of environmental conservation. Over the years, our plantation drives predominantly featured thorn plants like Desi Keekar and jungle jalebi. However, a recent transformation in our approach has shown our unwavering commitment to innovation and progress.

In this pioneering move, we've initiated a pilot project by planting 50 broad-leaf plants on a negligible budget. Led by our dedicated volunteer, **Kavita Ji**, an environmental scientist, we've carefully selected saplings and designed suitable pits for plantation. Our choice of plant species is the result of extensive research.

»»» WHY BROAD-LEAF PLANTS?

Because they offer diverse advantages. They foster biodiversity by providing shelter and sustenance for various wildlife species and are formidable carbon sequestrator, aiding in the fight against climate change.

One of the primary reasons for the success of angiosperms is their highly efficient reproductive system. They produce flowers, which often attract pollinators like insects, birds, and bats. This method of reproduction is more reliable and efficient compared to the wind-based pollination of many gymnosperms. The use of animals as pollinators increases the chances of successful fertilisation, leading to more consistent seed production.

»»» KAVITA JI: A WOMEN WITH A VISION

The project is being led by our **Environmental Scientist, Kavita Ji** along with the support of our ground operations leaders **Mr. Yash Ji** and **Mr. Raju Ji**. There were several complex steps involved during the initial stages of soil and pits preparations. Kavita Ji's transformative initiative was launched to cultivate a forest patch within the Aravali region, utilising native broad leaf species, totalling approximately 50 plants.

Her innovative vision and unwavering determination have played a pivotal role in the inception and ongoing sustenance of this remarkable project. Through her scientific acumen and commitment to preserving indigenous biodiversity, Kavita ji has set a commendable example for conservationists and environmentalists alike.
